Editorial– Ocean dynamics in 2024: overview and thank you to reviewers

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The editors of Ocean Dynamics (ODYN) would like to thank the hundreds of reviewers who spent time and effort in evaluating manuscripts in 2024 (special appreciation is due to the reviewers who provided multiple reviews during the year). Reviewers of ODYN come from sixty different countries, which helps evaluate geographically diverse worldwide research. Authors of papers are from dozens of different countries (top countries of published papers, in alphabetical order: Brazil, China, Germany, Greece, India, Italy, Japan, Netherlands United Kingdom and United States). ODYN aims in publishing the highest quality research papers on theoretical, computational, observational, and interdisciplinary oceanography, and a rigorous review process is essential for achieving this goal. As recognition of this invaluable service, Springer Nature offers reviewers the opportunity to credit the contribution to their profiles on ORCiD or Publons-Web of Science.

In May 2024 ODYN made an important transformation of the paper submission and review process from the Editorial Manager System to the new next-generation peer review system developed specifically for Springer Nature journals (SNAPP). Editors, authors, and reviewers commented positively on the more user-friendly new system. However, during the transition period, editors had the extra burden of handling papers on two different systems, and we appreciate their efforts. We hope that by early 2025 we will be able to complete the handling of the remaining papers in the old system.

We can happily report this year that the number of published papers, which declined during the COVID pandemic of 2020–2021, is now increasing again from forty-five published papers in the 2022 issue to fifty-one papers in 2023 and 62 papers in 2024. With the return of in-person meetings, ODYN started publishing again special issues (Topical

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Collections) from international conferences. We currently have four open collections, and two upcoming collections relating to international workshops and conferences in Canada, Germany, Japan, Singapore, and India. We would like to thank all the guest editors who helped manage the topical collections. If you are interested in publishing a special issue of peer reviewed papers from a meeting, please contact the Editor-in-Chief before the meeting for information how to proceed.

We also thank the dedicated editorial and production staff of Springer Nature who provided essential services to ODYN-Ron Doering, Lanie Mabanan and Christian Brian Abueva. Data availability There is no data related to the manuscript.
